Transportation Related Legislation Passed in the 2019 Session

Several legislative bills passed during the 2019 Session have now been signed and became law. Some of these new laws will affect local governments and cities and counties should carefully review these and make appropriate adjustments to local processes and ordinances to conform to these changes.

The Communications Services bill (SB 1000) requires special attention. During the last two years, FACERS has been concerned about the legislation affecting the permits for small cell facilities installed on public rights of way. This year SB 1000 made further changes to this process, but it also added similar provisions affecting installation of wired communications facilities in the rights of way. This could have a significant impact on local permitting processes.


