# Letter from the President, Brian Barnes

One of our first opportunities is the FDOT and working on developing Local Specifications for LAP projects. We have been invited to join this process to help write specifications the counties and cities will be using on LAP projects in the foreseeable future. This is a tremendous opportunity for us, and we need to be players in this process. Anyone with an interest in writing specs, please contact me so we can get this group together and working with the FDOT.
