INVESTING IN FLORIDA TRANSPORTATION

LARGEST FDOT BUDGET IN HISTORY: **\$12.6 BILLION**

- HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION: \$4.4 BILLION – ADDING 307 NEW LANE MILES
- BRIDGE MAINTENANCE: \$236.6 MILLION – REPAIRS AND REPLACEMENTS
- RESURFACING: \$1.2 BILLION – MAINTAINING 3,033 LANE MILES



INVESTING BEYOND ROADS:

- SEAPORTS: \$135.9 MILLION
- AVIATION: \$252.7 MILLION
- TRANSIT: \$672.8 MILLION
- SPACEPORTS: \$61.8 MILLION
- RAIL/FREIGHT: \$194.3 MILLION
