## LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The list of significant bills related to transportation and public works that were considered during the 2023 session was provided by FAC. The list can be accessed **HERE**.

For several years, FACERS has recommended legislation to index the local share of the motor fuel tax following the same procedure used for calculating the state share of the tax. This procedure provides an annual adjustment to the tax based on the Consumer Price Index and helps reduce the loss of buying power of the gas tax caused by inflation. Last year, FACERS also recommended legislation to assess user fees for electric and other alternate fuel vehicles that now make no contribution to the cost of building and maintaining the road system. Although no legislation was proposed to index the gas tax, SB 1070 was passed by the Senate and would have imposed additional license fees for electric and plug-in hybrid vehicles. The House did not consider the bill, and it failed.

At the FACERS Annual Meeting in June, FACERS again passed a resolution requesting that FAC include indexing the gas tax and assessing fees for electric vehicles as priorities for the 2024 legislative session. FAC develops legislative priorities during the fall, and the recommendation and support of one or more counties is critical to getting this issue added to the FAC legislative priority list.
