Traditional approach


Improve human behavior

Safe System approach

- Prevent death and serious injuries
- Design for human mistakes/limitations
 - Reduce system kinetic energy
- Individuals are responsible Share responsibility
- React based on crash history Proactively identify and address risks

1. Green Mountain Scenic Byway, Inc.

Green Mountain Scenic Overlook and Trailhead 40' Tower Addition

This project includes additional construction to an existing recreational facility along the Green Mountain Scenic Byway. The funds would be used to construct a second tower with an expanded deck 40 ft higher than the existing deck for enhanced viewing of Lake Apopka, the Lake Apopka North Shore Restoration Area, rocket launches from Cape Canaveral, as well as the Orlando skyline. The project will also include an elevator to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Project Cost: \$1,300,000 | Match: \$650,000 | Grant Request: \$650,000


