

- LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The Florida legislature has now convened for four of the six interim committee weeks, before the 60-day regular session begins. So far, committees have primarily heard from agency leaders and subject matter experts on high level issues. A large tranche of bills is expected to be filed shortly before the March 4 filing deadline. The remaining committee meeting schedule is as follows:

February 10-14, 2025: Committee week 5 **February 17-21, 2025:** Committee week 6 **March 4, 2025:** Start of Regular session/bill filing deadline

FAC's 2025 <u>Legislative Action Plan</u> includes a handful of policy priorities that may be of interest to FACERS. These include:

- The authority to index local fuel taxes to CPI, to keep pace with rising maintenance costs
- A registration fee on electric vehicles to replace lost fuel tax revenue

NACE UPDATE



Greetings from Washington, where we find ourselves in a brave new world of a new Administration with a breadth of plans never seen in American politics. With too many proposals and actions to name, we are of course laser-focused on changes to programs our members depend on. For example, a temporary freeze was put into effect that affected some DOT discretionary grant programs. This freeze lasted approximately 36 hours but provided us a substantial glimpse into what may be coming next. Stay tuned....

These events in Washington are a prime example of why our annual advocacy fly-in is so crucial. With plans to visit with the White House and USDOT (among

others), it is crucial that we educate policymakers and stakeholders on what we need to successfully serve our communities. Funding and direct funding are vital to local infrastructure projects, and with continuous staff turnover in Washington, we must repeat our message to educate those who control the fate of these programs. FACERS will have a representative at our fly-in later this month, and we thank you for your contributions to this important piece of our advocacy efforts.

Preparations are in the final stretch for our 2025 annual conference in Schaumburg, Illinois. With a schedule public for referral, we have witnessed registration numbers which will result in the best show NACE has ever hosted, not to mention the biggest. We hope you make plans to join us. The host hotel is about 98% full as of this writing, and we have commissioned an overflow hotel to meet demand. Click **HERE** for more details.

NACE continues its work on its new strategic plan, conceived during our fall Board meeting in Toronto. This plan, which has advocacy, membership, financial stability and education as its pillars, will provide a clear vision for NACE moving forward. President McCall briefed FACERS members in Tampa this past December, and I look forward to keeping you appraised of our progress in June.


FACERS FALL MEETING RECAP
